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





DAVID WILLIAMSON AO

David Williamson is the most produced playwright in the history of Australian theatre. For over fifty years his plays have continued to attract strong audiences for many theatre companies across the country, not least the Ensemble Theatre where 19 world premieres of his plays have been presented. Appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in 1983, David has also been named one of Australia's Living National Treasures.


In 1970 David's first full-length play, THE COMING OF STORK, premiered at the La Mama Theatre in Carlton, Victoria. Two years later THE REMOVALISTS was the co-winner of the coveted George Devine Award, the first time it had been given to a writer from outside the UK. The play also won two Australian Writers' Guild AWGIE Awards for best stage play and best script. David went on to scoop up ten more AWGIE Awards throughout his prolific career.

A revival of EMERALD CITY in 1995 sparked Ensemble Theatre's strong and enduring relationship with David Williamson, going on to stage 29 seasons of his plays and producing three national tours. In 2014 Williamson had a record eight plays professionally produced across Sydney alone, including THE JACK MANNING TRILOGY presented by Ensemble Theatre at The Concourse in Chatswood and a sell-out season of CRUISE CONTROL here at our harbourside venue.

David's plays have been translated into many languages and there have been major productions in London, Los Angeles, Washington and New York – where The New Yorker hailed him as 'Ibsen in the Antipodes'. With a number of his stage works adapted for screen, David soon began to write movie scripts earning himself five Australian Film Institute Awards and receiving a nomination for best screenplay from the Writer's Guild of America.

This year Ensemble Theatre is proud to present the iconic writer's play NEARER THE GODS and looks forward to continuing to stage classic Williamson plays for future generations.
