WRITER'S NOTE

'Writer's notes' are funny things; part memoir, part confession, part joyous outburst: yay, it's a play! With an audience! In a pandemic!

Two Eurasian siblings, Mel and Eric, Malaysian and Australian, feeling both and neither. Mel's memory of childhood is not the same as Eric's even though they are siblings who experienced similar childhood upbringings. Penang of the past seems a magical place; Mel faced a baby cobra, Eric thinks he remembers a shop full of paper clothes, they both remember the incense smoke. But the past is a tricky thing and opening the door ushers in early memories of Australia too, ballroom dancing trophies yes but also a family fracturing, casual and not so casual racism, bullying and abuse.

THE ONE is a story of being Asian Australian, we people who occupy the liminal space, with one foot rooted heavily here in Australia and the other delicately poised across an ocean. Blending identity, culture and family make a potent soup, and so it is for all with our feet in two worlds, tasting 'chunks neither chicken nor corn'.

PLAYWRIGHT

Vanessa Bates is an awardwinning playwright and screen-writer.

Previous plays include A GHOST IN MY SUITCASE

(the play), TRAILER, EVERY SECOND, THE MAGIC HOUR, PORN.CAKE, CHECKLIST FOR AN ARMED ROBBER, DARLING OSCAR, and most recently SMALL HARD TRUTHS. Vanessa has been produced at The Sydney Opera House, Victorian Arts Centre, Malthouse Theatre, Barking Gecko, Sydney Theatre Company, Darlinghurst Theatre, Black Swan Theatre, Griffin, Deckchair, Theatre@Risk, atyp, Tantrum and many others. For her plays she has won Australian Writers Guild Awards and a NSW Premiers Literary Award and been nominated for the Griffin and Patrick White Awards. Most of Vanessa's plays have been published. In 2021 several short scripts were included in two anthologies: THE CURVE and SHARP DARTS (both by Currency Press). THE ONE is Vanessa's second play produced by the Ensemble, her first play was LIGHT BEGINS TO FADE written as part of THE ANZAC PROJECT in 2015.



DARREN YAP DIRECTOR

Darren returned early this year from DUBAI WORLD EXPO 2020 where he staged cultural shows at Al Wasal Plaza for Artists in Motion. In April 2022 he directed JOSEPH AND

HIS AMAZING TECHNICOLOR DREAMCOAT in Tokyo and his production of THE LAST FIVE YEARS for La Boite Theatre, Brisbane, opened to acclaim in June. In August, Darren will direct a new Australian work YONG for Monkey Baa Theatre. In 2020-2021 Darren directed NEXT TO NORMAL for NIDA; the re-mount of JESUS WANTS ME FOR A SUNBEAM for The National Theatre of Parramatta at Belvoir Street and DOUBLE DELICIOUS for The Sydney Festival and Contemporary Asian Australian Performance (CAAP). Darren is a Director who has worked in the Australian and overseas industry for more than 30 years.
