Michael Frayn was born in London in 1933 and began his career as a journalist on the Guardian and the Observer. He has

written seventeen plays, including NOISES OFF, COPENHAGEN, and DEMOCRACY, translated Chekhov's last four plays, and adapted the first as WILD HONEY. His screenplays include CLOCKWISE, and among his eleven novels are THE TIN MEN, TOWARDS THE END OF THE MORNING, HEADLONG, SPIES, and SKIOS. Non-fiction: THE HUMAN TOUCH and MY FATHER'S FORTUNE. Most recent: three collections of short entertainments, MATCHBOX THEATRE, POCKET PLAYHOUSE, and MAGIC MOBILE. He is married to the writer Claire Tomalin.

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

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
